

How to Pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy

In 1935 St. Maria Faustina Kowalska started this devotion as a reminder of the message to trust in Jesus' endless mercy & to live life mercifully toward others. Blessed John Paul II established Divine Mercy Sunday for the entire church. It is customary to recite this prayer at 3 p.m., the hour when Jesus died on the cross. The novena said for nine days, starting on Good Friday and ending by receiving Eucharist on the first Sunday after Easter.



Take your rosary, make the Sign of the Cross then pray one Our Father, one Hail Mary & the Apostles' Creed.

Our Father

Our Father, who art heaven, hallowed be they name; thy Kindgom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

Hail Mary

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you. Blessed are you among woman, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate. was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell: on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven. and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty: from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church. the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body. and life everlasting. Amen.

Then, **on the Our Father beads** say the following:

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of your dearly beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

On each of the Hail Mary beads, pray the following:

For the sake of his sorrowful passion, Have mercy on us and on the whole world.

When you have recited these prayers on all five decades of the rosary, recite the following prayer three times:

> Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

End with the sign of the cross.
