Retired Sergeant First Class Bryan Schrader, 46, was born and raised in Canton, Ohio. At age 18, he enlisted in the U.S. Army and received training at Fort Benning, Georgia.

Bryan's first assignment was to 1st Ranger Battalion from 1992 until 1994, where he served several positions. In 1995 he served on a Long Range Surveillance Team in the 2nd Infantry Division as a Senior Scout Observer. From 1996 to 1999, he returned to 1st Ranger Battalion and served as a Rifle Fire Team Leader and a Rifle Squad Leader. In 1999, Bryan attended RRD Selection and was assigned to the 75th Regimental Reconnaissance Detachment in Fort Benning from 2000 until 2004, where he served on Reconnaissance Team 3 on combat deployments in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. In 2005, he was assigned to the Special Forces U.S. Army John F. Kennedy Special Warfare Center and School as a Military Freefall Instructor.

In 2007, Bryan was involved in a near-fatal parachuting accident that left him with a traumatic brain injury, herniated disks in his neck and additional injuries that continue to impact him today. Bryan returned to duty as an instructor until medically retired in 2014. He counts multiple awards for military service among his accomplishments including: The Ranger Tab, Combat Infantry Badge, Master Military Freefall Badge with Bronze Star Device, Master Parachutist Badge with Bronze Star Device, Joint Service Commendation Medal and a Meritorious Service Medal.

Bryan currently lives in Wichita Falls, Texas with his wife Courtney and their 9-year-old daughter. Courtney is a first-year elementary school teacher and Bryan serves as an avid volunteer at their daughter's school. While focusing on his healing and rehabilitation, he also enjoys the outdoors and spends time hunting, fishing and blacksmithing.

The family is preparing to move much closer to Bryan's childhood home, this time to Sheffield Village, Ohio, where they will live in a newly renovated, mortgage-free home from Freedom Alliance and U.S. Bank. They look forward to the upcoming relocation that will put them closer to family in Cleveland and the vital medical care Bryan needs to continue to heal.
