



CDC Guidelines for Church

Council has made the decision to open slowly and carefully with precaution, guided by the CDC and the state of Ohio guidelines. Based on science and local Covid data we will make determinations on how to proceed while keeping our congregation safe.

Vaccinated people may enter the sanctuary without a mask; unvaccinated individuals are asked to continue to wear a mask. We will continue to social distance in the marked pews, with families allowed to sit together. Hymnals, pew cards, passing of the collection plate and communion may be reintroduced at a later date. *Please wear your mask if you want to sing aloud.* Elbow bump and the peace sign are acceptable forms of greeting; no hand shaking. We ask that you socialize <u>outside</u> in the parking lot. This is a fluid situation and may possibly change from week to week. Thanks to all of you for your continued patience.

From Prayer Ministry & Compassionate Care

As with any change, as we find other ways to get our church service out to people (Facebook, Zoom, etc.), there are bound to be glitches. St. Peter's glitch is not everyone is able to hear. Zoom, and some in service itself, can't hear announcements made by the general congregation so everything must be repeated by Pastor. Because our prayers and concerns are not for the general public, they have had to be announced prior to the Facebook connection being made. This is why we always have down time after announcements and before actual service starts. At this time, prayers and concerns will no longer be announced prior to or during church services. Surgeries, illness, other concerns will be addressed by Pastor in a general fashion in his prayer.

BUT...we know you would like to continue to prayer for those in our church family. St. Peter's does have a Prayer Ministry that you are welcome to join. There are no meetings. You will receive an email the beginning of each month with prayer requests for specific needs. You choose your method, time and degree of prayer. It's that simple. In addition, there will be prayer request and visitor cards available by the offering plate. These cards can also be used if you would like the pastor the call you. Please complete the card and drop it back in the offering plate. If you attend service thru Zoom or Facebook and have a prayer request, please call the church office. Either way, please indicate if you would like the prayer request to be confidential.
