“lim-i-nal”

1. Relating to a transitional or initial stage of a process.
2. Occupying a position at, or on both sides of, a boundary or threshold.

St. Peter's People,

Are you familiar with the word “liminal”? Look it up in your dictionary, or Google it. Liminal indicates physical or emotional space between one thing or process and another.

Remember before Covid: flying in an airplane or riding a train? As soon as you stepped onto the jet-way or up onto the train steps, you stepped into liminality. You were no longer standing in the airport building or on the rail platform. You were not yet inside the airplane or train car. You stood on the threshold.

Remember before I arrived: after Pastor Bev's passing, after Pastor Brian's bridge ministry? Both you, St. Peter's, and I existed in emotional liminality. I was busy getting ready while keeping up with my ongoing stuff. I also felt anxious in a good way: a new geography, a new community of faith, new relationships, ministry both familiar by category and brand new.

Upon arriving we both walked across a threshold into a room, so to speak, called Interim Pastor and People. One liminal event

ended. Another began, namely, your work in healing and reconciling; also, your work in discovering and discerning your holy vocation: spiritual and emotional gestation, wilderness, wandering, waiting, learning, growing ...

How strange. Human beings are designed for liminality. Those who study the brain know that body and emotional wellness are at their best when expertise and temperament are growing and contributing. A well-cared for body provides for a brain ready to step onto the jet-way, and a well exercised brain provides for a well-balanced, capable-for-the-journey body.

At the same time, standing on the jetway creates a bit of unease, worry, and anxiety. The way into the cabin of the plane can feel too hot or too cold, claustrophobic, tiring, un-steady. This in-between can prompt the brain to ignore the here and now in favor of the past or future.

Church communities, like each one of us, prefer certainty, though we are better off (brain science-wise) with a little uncertainty. And St.

Peter's people, this liminality describes Jesus' ministry, as March Sundays guide us to Easter, as March days guide us toward my farewell and your hello to Pastor Chris.

So, I am offering a word in celebration of liminality. Easter celebration and the next relationship will arrive just on time. Of course, your feet and your heart are turning with glad anticipation toward Easter Sunday and Pastor Chris' celebrative arrival on June 1st. Yet, the rich benefits of our faith-walk flow from the everyday experience of living, more than from arriving. Everyday living, done with open eyes and hearts, keep us in a little uncertainty. It's in this liminality that God joins with us and where we are most nourished, because here we grow, we learn, we contribute. The day of resurrection, moments of certainty and rest, are just that, a time to laugh, or weep, to say "alleluia", to shout "hello!" and sing "farewell!"

My eyes and heart are turning to my next congregation, and I know not where or when. Like you, I will again join with another, full of hope and faith and anticipation. As soon as I cross the threshold, I will, as will they, move into emotional and spiritual liminal space. I wonder what the stories of Jesus will offer us this March. I expect they will show how God and faithful ones keep meeting one another on the way from where they have been.

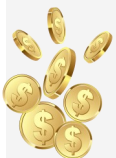

Compassionate Care and Prayer Ministry are separate groups.

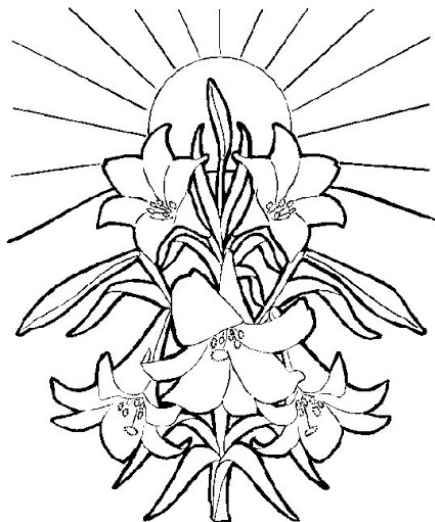
All of Compassionate Care team is in the Prayer Ministry, but not all of Prayer Ministry is on Compassionate Care. Below is a quick description of what, but not limited to, each group does.

Compassionate Care has a dedicated list of people in care facilities, home-bound, hospital, and serious medical problems. We give more attention to these people with visits (not during covid), phone calls, cards, care bags, run errands, drive to appointments, help fill out forms, drop off meals now and then, small home repairs, help get connected with county resources, and other things if needed. We don't take over the responsibility of family, we just fill in cracks. We stay in contact

with Pastor and he with us, regarding these people. Communion is taken to them if they are not able to do Zoom (depending on covid). We also do confidential prayers.

Prayer ministry is a group of people that receive an e-mail once a month with a list of people to pray for. This list consists of our congregation in need of prayer and friends of St. Peters. It does not include confidential prayers. Each person prays in their own way. There is also a **Zoom Prayer Room** that meets on Zoom every Wednesday at 1:00 for needed prayer....very simple..name.."Lord hear our prayer". The meeting lasts approximately 20-30 minutes.

We are always open to new members for these groups.

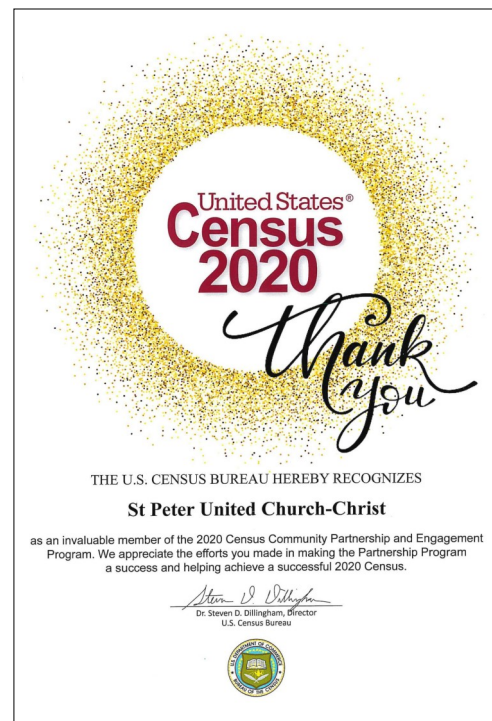

*MARCH SERMON SCRIPTURE READINGS

3/7 John 2:13-22

The Passover of the Jews was near, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. In the temple he found people selling cattle, sheep, and doves, and the money-changers seated at their tables. Making a whip of cords, he drove all of them out of the temple, both the sheep and the cattle. He also poured out the coins of the money-changers and overturned their tables. He told those who were selling the doves, 'Take these things out of here! Stop making my Father's house a market-place!' His disciples remembered that it was written, 'Zeal for your house will consume me.' The Jews then said to him, 'What sign can you show us for doing this?' Jesus answered them, 'Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews then said, 'This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and will you raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the temple of his body. After he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this; and they believed the scripture and the word that Jesus had spoken.

3/14 John 3:1-21

Now there was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. He came to Jesus by night and said to him, 'Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God.' Jesus answered him, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above.' Nicodemus said to him, 'How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?' Jesus answered, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not be astonished that I said to you, "You must be born from above." The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.' Nicodemus said to him, 'How can these things be?' Jesus answered him, 'Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things?

'Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

'For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

'Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. Those who believe in him are not condemned; but those who do not believe are condemned already, because they have not believed in the name of the only Son of God. And this is the judgment, that the light has come into the world, and people loved darkness rather than light because their deeds were evil. For all who do evil hate the light and do not come to the light, so that their deeds may not be exposed. But those who do what is true come to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that their deeds have been done in God.'

3/21 Jeremiah 31:31-37

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt—a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the Lord. But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, 'Know the Lord', for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the Lord; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

Thus says the Lord,
who gives the sun for light by day
and the fixed order of the moon and the stars for light by night,
who stirs up the sea so that its waves roar—
the Lord of hosts is his name:
If this fixed order were ever to cease
from my presence, says the Lord,
then also the offspring of Israel would cease
to be a nation before me for ever.

Thus says the Lord:
If the heavens above can be measured,
and the foundations of the earth below can be explored,
then I will reject all the offspring of Israel
because of all they have done, says the Lord.

3/28 Mark 11:1-11

When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples and said to them, 'Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, "Why are you doing this?" just say this, "The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately." ' They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, some of the bystanders said to them, 'What are you doing, untying the colt?' They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting,

'Hosanna!

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!
Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David!
Hosanna in the highest heaven!'

Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.

A motion was made to accept the Treasurer's Report. It was seconded and passed. A motion was also made to include the General Funds Summary in The Key. The motion was seconded and passed.

Financial Secretary's Report

Becky Woods, Financial Secretary, presented the January 2021 Incoming Funds Report. Total incoming funds for January were \$11,937.71. A motion was made to accept the January 2021 Incoming Funds Report. The motion was seconded and passed.

Review January 2021 Council Meeting Minutes and January 31, 2021 Congregational Meeting Minutes

No changes were made to the January 31, 2021 Congregational Meeting Minutes. One correction was made to the January 23, 2021 Council Meeting Minutes. Referring to the Worship committee report section, the last word in the first sentence, "added," should be changed

to "proposed." A motion was made to accept the correction to the January 23, 2021 Council Meeting Minutes. It was seconded and the motion was passed.

Final Discussion of Proposed Changes Regarding Membership Criteria to Church Constitution and By-Laws

Pastor Arlen reviewed the sections in the constitution and by-laws to which proposed changes have been recommended with current wording vs. proposed changes. He explained the definition of "rights" (what we receive). Mary-K suggested that the names of council members and contact information be added to the package so that congregation members who had questions would be able to submit those questions to council members for explanation. A consensus was reached on adding council member names and contact information in the mailing and email package for the purpose of contacting and submitting questions to council members.

Ash Wednesday

The Ash Wednesday service will be at 7:00 p.m. on February 17, 2021. Ashes will be placed in small plastic bags before the service, and attendees may pick up a bag and apply the ashes to themselves or family members.

Delegates to Living Waters and Heartland Conference

Pastor Arlen indicated that Council appoints delegates to the above UCC events. Attendees will be announced at the annual congregational meeting in November 2021. The appointees will attend these meetings in 2022.

Movement Works

At the last Trustee meeting, the Trustees decided to terminate the Movement Works rental agreement.

A letter was mailed on 2/12/21 informing Jess Widener of the termination of the rental agreement and the move out date is 4/13/21.

Trustees Report

Jim Kubuske gave the Trustees Report from the trustees meeting on 2/5/21:

-Sealing and painting the parking lot—The trustees had estimates from Tiger at \$3,914 and Griffith at \$3,972. Jim indicated that possibly they may select Griffith because Griffith did the initial work on the parking lot.

• Electronic Sign—Jim indicated that the price of the sign from Stewart Signs, Florida, was \$18,080 uninstalled and installation costs would be an additional \$2,000-\$2,500. Jim has also contacted Wagner Signs (local) for an estimate. Their sign would use our existing sign frame and posts, but an electronic display panel would be added to our sign. Jim hopes to receive a price on this unit tomorrow.

• The trustees received complaints that the chandeliers in the sanctuary were not bright enough. Jim is waiting on an estimate for this upgrade.

• Repairing the chimney—Jim was trying to find the name of the person who had previously been contacted to do this work.

• Sanding and refinishing the front doors--waiting until winter weather breaks.

• Numerous light bulbs have been replaced in the preschool.

• The trustees are looking at buying additional LED light bulbs, three new light fixtures for the preschool, and a new lock for the office door. All of these items would be paid for through the Trustees fund.

Christian Education

Jessie Kubuske gave the Christian Education report. There will be an Easter Egg Hunt, possibly virtual. Jessie is still working on ideas about this activity. She is working on Vacation Bible School. It could be virtual, in-person, or even held outside. The noisy collection is donated to **Sleep in Heavenly Peace**.

Compassionate Care

Lenten Bags and Care Bags were delivered to Amherst Manor and to several of our members.

Worship

Mary-K reported that someone may be interested in being back up for Mary-K on the Zoom camera once a month and when Mary-K is ill, etc. Pastor Arlen indicated that Daniel Jacky is working on worship music up until early summer.

Circle 6

Sally Readinger noted that Circle 6 will be having a Zoom meeting on Tuesday, 2/16/21 at 7:00 p.m. Sally asked if Circle 6 would be able to use Fellowship Hall for a meeting. Approval was given as long as the number of attendees is under 15 persons, masks are worn, and social distancing is maintained. Any upcoming meetings should be coordinated with Kaye Oswald in order to get the event on the church calendar.

Spiritual Life

Pastor Arlen reported that between now and June a review of the membership rolls will take place.

Other Items

Sally Readinger asked if a code could be added to the copier so that those who use the copier will have the cost of copies made charged back to their departments. This item was referred to the trustees. Sue Conkle asked if the carillon could be programmed to play again at noon, etc. Sue Conkle will contact Brian Schieferstein with her request.

The meeting was adjourned by consensus. Mary-K gave a closing prayer and the meeting ended at 8:58 p.m.
