Lessons for the week of April 20

Monday-Tuesday

Letter Nn / Number 9:

<u>Introduce the letter Nn and number 9:</u> Show your child a letter Nn flash card and have them make the letter sound. Have them give you examples of words that start with the letter Nn.

Show your child the number 9. Have them clap, jump, stamp their feet as they count up to 9.

<u>Nn for Nest Paper</u>: Have your child trace upper case letter \underline{N} and the lower-case letter \underline{n} . Have your child practice writing 3 upper case and 3 lower case letters on the back to practice. Don't forget to have your child practice writing their name on paper. For the older children, first and last names.

<u>Large Motor Game: Bird in Nest-</u> Using a hula hoop, have your child pretend to be an egg in the nest. Instruct your child to slowly peck thru the egg, stretch their wings, hop in nest flapping their wings and finally fly away. Can be played inside or outside.

Number 9 Jar Paper: Have your child trace and write the number 9. Have them draw 9 eggs in the jar.

Read Book: Noah's Ark / A Sneak a Peek Series Birds Who Am I?

Wednesday

<u>Review the letter Nn and number 9:</u> Show your child a letter Nn flash card and have them make the letter sound. Have them find one item that start with the letter Nn.

Show the number 9 flash card and have them count out 9 items (ex. Legos, cereal, crayons, etc.).

<u>Art:</u> Robin in Nest Paper- Have you child color than cut bird, nest, eggs. Add shredded paper to bird nest. Glue on eggs and robin to nest.

<u>Letter Ee small motor activity:</u> Have your child use 4 popsicle sticks to make the letter E. Afterwards give them 9 popsicle sticks to make different letters.

<u>9 Noodles Project Paper</u>: Have your child write the number 9 and letter N to finish the word noodles. Give your child 9 noodles to glue on paper.

<u>Large Motor Game:</u> On a large piece of paper, draw a big flower. Have your child stand behind a line and try to toss a beanbag onto the flower. Each time they make it, move the line back a bit. See how far away from the flower they get!

Thursday-Friday

<u>Review the letter Nn and number 9:</u> Show your child a letter Nn flash card and have them make the letter sound. Have them find words in a book that start with the letter Nn.

Show the number 9 flash card. Have your child tell you 9 things they like to eat.

<u>Art:</u> N for night- On a black sheet of construction paper, have your child write the letter N in yellow crayon. Have them cut a yellow moon, glue to paper and color nine white stars or add 9 star stickers.

Large Motor: Go outside and find items and build your own nest. Look for 9 pretty flowers on a walk.

<u>Fine Motor:</u> Draw a picture for someone special and sign your name. Have your child describe what they drew and write it on the back for their special person to read. You can use this activity to send it to someone who may need a little pick-me-up.

Practice writing the letter Nn and the number 9.

My Big World: Save The Critters From Litter-Look over and discuss with your child.

<u>Letters, Numbers and Shapes Jar</u>: Have a jar with slips of paper. On each piece write an upper-case letter, lower-case letter, a shape or number. Have your child pick a piece of paper out of the jar and have them identify what is on the paper. For the older children, simple sight words can be added.
